ALL SOULS DAY

Black vestments on All Souls Day??? - The use of black vestments on All Souls Day is rooted in the tradition of mourning and prayer for the dead. While black signifies death and sin, it also serves as a reminder of our mortality..." Remember, you are dust and unto dust you shall return." The color black was traditionally used for Requiem Masses, including All Souls Day, to honor the memory of those who have passed away and to encourage the Faithful to reflect on the significance of life and death in the Christian Faith. We must also never forget that we are called to yearn and hope for the "resurrection to eternal life" won for us by the mystery of our Lord's suffering, death and resurrection!
