Reception of Holy Communion – Friends, our reception of Jesus in Holy Communion is both a strong sign of our unity as Catholics and a personal, sacramental encounter with Him. If I could ask you to remember a couple of things:
1) If you receive in your hands, please place your left hand on top of your right hand. Envision making a “throne” of Jesus. This enables you to place the Sacred Host in your mouth with your right hand. It also allows the priest or minister to properly place the Sacred Host without any doubt as where to place it and/or prevents any danger of dropping.
2) If you receive on your tongue, please extend your tongue far enough to prevent the priest or minister from placing their fingers inside your mouth or having contact with your lips. Likewise, please do not close your mouth until our fingers are away from your mouth/lips. This is not only for sanitary reasons but also for reverence.

Thank you for your attention and reverence for this intimate time of prayer!

A theme of the Diocese of Nyundo for 2026

This year, we humbly seek your support for 2 important project that are vital to the life and growth of our Church and our people:

1. Education for girls:

In our region, traditional gender roles often dictate that boy's education is more valuable than girls. Girls are sometimes seen as primarily responsible for domestic duties and childcare, while boys are expected to pursue education and careers, while girls are often married in exchange for dowries, treated merely as a source of income. This injustice not only impoverished young women of their dignity but also maintains cycles of poverty and inequality.

While progress has been in some areas, significant challenges remain in achieving gender parity in education in Nyundo. Some studies show that while girls may be catching up in terms of primary school enrollment, they continue to face higher dropout rates and lower completion rates at secondary and higher levels.

Diocese of Nyundo efforts to address these inequalities, she is planning to build primary school and secondary school for them in order to empower girls to be educated which is a tool for creating a better community.

1. Clean water

Many of our remote areas lack reliable access to clean water, people share contaminated water sources with livestock, leading to widespread illness and tragic loss of life. People requiring to travel long distances or rely on contaminated sources. So, proving local water sources as crucial, basic need and improves overall quality of life.

Many faiths, including Christianity, emphasize compassion, service to others, and caring to the poor and vulnerable. Drilling wells and providing clean water are seen as concrete way to live out these principles and demonstrates love and care for their community.

Churches often work with local communities, training them on well maintenance and repair to ensure the longevity of the water source.

Each well costs approximately \$8,000. With your support, we can continue to offer a gift of live and health to our community.

We invite your diocese to partner with us in one of these two projects. These efforts are not just ours-they are the mission of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church, lived out through the Diocese of Nyundo.
