PANA NURSING HOMES

MILITARY SERVICES COLLECTION "Serving Those Who Serve"

Our parish will take up the <u>Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services</u>, <u>USA (AMS)</u> in November. It is a collection approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years. The AMS provides pastoral care to Catholic men and women serving in all six branches of the U.S. Armed Forces, Veterans, and their families, – including those from our own parish and diocese. The AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military, and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment. Please consider giving generously.

ALL SOULS DAY

Black vestments on All Souls Day??? — The use of black vestments on All Souls Day is rooted in the tradition of mourning and prayer for the dead. While black signifies death and sin, it also serves as a reminder of our mortality..." Remember, you are dust and unto dust you shall return." The color black was traditionally used for Requiem Masses, including All Souls Day, to honor the memory of those who have passed away and to encourage the Faithful to reflect on the significance of life and death in the Christian Faith. We must also never forget that we are called to yearn and hope for the "resurrection to eternal life" won for us by the mystery of our Lord's suffering, death and resurrection!
